Breeders awarded the Breeder Excellence Behavior and Socialization badge must establish and maintain an enrichment plan that outlines two out of three of the following enrichment categories: (1) animal to animal interaction, (2) human to animal interaction, and (3) environmental stimulation.

A written enrichment plan must be submitted to the Board of Animal Health (Board) for review by Board agents and appointed industry advisors and must be made available to an agent of the Board at the time of inspection. Enrichment plans may be returned to the applicant if deemed incomplete or inadequate.

In addition, participants will be required to keep a log that details implementation of the enrichment plan. A log template is available on the <u>Board's website (http://www.bah.state.mn.us/breeder-excellence/)</u>. These logs will be reviewed by agents of the Board during inspection.

Breeders applying for the Breeder Excellence Behavior and Socialization badge may use this template or may submit a plan in an original format for review by the Board.
